

The HEP-TITLE package*

Extensions for the title page

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Abstract

The HEP-TITLE package extends the title macros of the standard classes with macros for a preprint, affiliation, editors, and endorsers.

To use the HEP-TITLE package include it with `\usepackage{hep-title}`.

Most macros are intended for the use in the preamble. They are implemented using the TITLING [1] and AUTHBLK [2] packages.

1 Macros

If the HYPERREF package is loaded the portable document format meta information is set according to the `\title{<text>}` and `\author{<text>}` information.

1.1 Title

`\series` The `\series{<series>}` places a series title above the usual title generated via `\title{<title>}`. The `\subtitle{<subtitle>}` macro places a subtitle below the usual title. The fonts and their size can be adjusted using the `\seriesfont{}`, `\titlefont{}`, and `\subtitlefont{}` macros.

1.2 Authors

`\subtitlefont` In order to facilitate multiple authors with different affiliations the AUTHBLK package [2] is extended. The author macro is extended to take a affiliation label `\author[<label>]{<name>}`. The affiliation macro takes the corresponding label `\affiliation[<label>]{<institution>}`. Additionally, the `\email{email}` macro places a link containing the email in typewrite font into a footnote. The fonts can be adjusted using the `\authorfont{}` and `\affiliationfont{}` macros. The following lines add e.g. two authors with different affiliations

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`\author[affil2]{Author two \email{email two}}`
`\affiliation[affil1,affil2]{Affiliation two}`

`\editor` Additionally the `\editor[label]{name}` and `\endorser[label]{name}` macros
`\endorser` are provided that act similar to the `\author[label]{name}` macros but place their
`\editorfont` content in a dedicated line. Their font can be adjusted by the `\editorfont{font}`
`\endorserfont` and `\endorserfont{font}`. The titles of these lines can be adjusted using the
`\editortitle` `\editortitle{singular}{plural}` and `\endorsertitle{singular}{plural}` macros.
`\endorsertitle` Their font can be adjust with the `\editortitlefont{font}` and `\endorsertitlefont{font}`.

1.3 Abstract

`\editortitlefont` The `abstract` environment is adjusted to not start with an indentation. The `abstract*`
`\endorsertitlefont` environment takes care of placing the title as well. This is used in `twocolumn`
`abstract (env.)` documents if the abstract should span both columns.

1.4 Preprint

`\preprint` The `\preprint{numer}` macro places a pre-print number in the upper right corner
`\preprintfont` of the title page. The `\preprintfont` macro can be used to change the font of the
preprint.
